# Stangate House and Garden Map



## Stangate Significant Tree Trail

### Start from Edgeware road gate

1. Stangate House was built in 1940 for Rev Raymond and Mrs Gwyneth Cornish (nee Thomas) on the land owned by her mother Florence. Well known garden designer Elsie Cornish, older sister of Raymond helped design and plant the garden. Gwyneth gave the property to the National Trust in 1966.
2. *Corymbia* sp WA flowering gum Flowers Feb
3. *Fraxinus* x 'Raywood' Claret Ash
4. *Betula pendula* Silver Birch
5. Heritage Rose collection donated by Heritage Rose Society of SA planted winter 2021
6. *Magnolia x soulangeana* deciduous, deep burgundy flowers in August
7. *Ginkgo biloba* Maidenhair tree
8. *Cupressus aurea saligna* underplanted with azaleas in 2025
9. *Cedrus atlantica glauca* Blue Atlas cedar
10. *Liquidambar styraciflua* x 2
11. Miniature camellias refers to size of flowers not the size of the shrubs. Flowers June -Sept
12. *Azalea kurume*, small leaved, hardy azaleas flower from autumn through to spring
13. Rhododendrons on hill planted 2025
14. *Quercus robur 'Concordia'* Golden oak (rare)
15. *Sorbus acuparia* Rowan
16. *Acer palmatum* Japanese maples and 2 elms
17. Sasanqua camellias, narrow leaved, sun hardy perfumed flowering March-May
18. *Fagus sylvatica purpurea* Copper beech x 3
19. *Cornus kousa*, C. Celestial, C. Constellation Dogwoods flowering in October-Nov
20. Leawood camellias over 130 years old transplanted in 1996 from Devil's Elbow when SE freeway was being built
21. Espaliered Sasanqua hedge
22. *Quercus robur*, English oak second largest in Australia may be 180 years old.
23. 30 Rhododendrons planted 2024
24. *Cedrus deodar* Himalayan Cedar
25. *Laburnum anagyroides* x 10 over archway flowering October.
26. *Populus nigra Italica* Lombardy poplar
27. Topiary camellias planted autumn 2021.
28. *Wollemia nobilis* Wollomi pine
29. *Liquidambar styraciflua* x 4
30. Higo camellias originally bred for their open flowers with prominent stamens by the Samurai class in Japan (before 1867)

### Start from Euston road gate

31. Boundary hedge was planted with seedlings grown by Camellia Society members who, in 1977, started planting this collection of camellias which now numbers over 800. The garden was officially opened in 1982. It was awarded the honour of an 'International Camellia Garden of Excellence' in 2012
32. *Pseudotsugo menziesii* x 3 Douglas firs
33. Sasanqua camellias clipped as low hedges
34. Wisteria over cupola, flowers in Sept-Oct
35. *Camellia reticulatas* have large leaves, large flowers and big brown furry seed pods
36. *Zelkova serrata* (in elm family)
37. *Oxydendrum arboreum* Sorrel Tree
38. Modern Camellia Japonicas (post 1970)
39. *Nyssa sylvatica* Tupelo
40. *Quercus robur* English oak
41. *Tilia platyphyllos* large leaved Linden
42. *Eucalyptus botryoides* Swamp mahogany underplanted with hellebores
43. *Liriodendron tulipifera* Tulip tree
44. *Acer negundo* Box elder
45. *Fagus sylvatica* Beech
46. *Acer pseudoplatanus?* Red leaved Sycamore
47. *Fraxinus* sp Ash
48. *Ilex aquifolium* Holly x3
49. Cross back over creek into the Birdbath garden planted with hydrangeas and ferns
50. *Camellia Elegans* bred for tolerance to full shade interplanted with *Azalea indica*
51. *Eucalyptus camaldulensis* River Red Gum
52. Rhododendrons and Mollis azaleas flowering September-Nov underplanted with *Cyclamen hederifolium* flowering March-May
53. *Robinia pseudoacacia* Honey locust
54. *Aesculus* sp Horse Chestnut
55. *Quercus coccinea* Scarlet oak
56. Historical camellias bred before 1920
57. *Cedrus atlantica glauca* Blue Atlantic cedar
58. *Quercus robur* English oak
59. *Fagus sylvatica purpurea* Copper beech
60. *Cercis siliquastrum* Judas tree
61. *Tilia cordata* x 4 Linden or Lime tree lining original driveway
62. *Arbutus unedo* Irish strawberry tree
63. Hawthorn hedge
64. *Fagus sylvatica* Copper Beech
